MENUHIN PROGRAMS

- SCHOOL** ● **P4 PROGRAM (PRE-COVID)**
- Free group lessons in schools
 - ~150 students taught per year
 - 18 public school
 - 5 private school

- ORCHESTRA** ● **SATURDAY ORCHESTRA & GROUP**
- 50 students
 - From 5 years to 67 years old

- LESSONS** ● **PRIVATE LESSONS**
- Subsidized rates for private lessons to ensure affordability
 - over 100 students participates
 - ~10% receives full bursary

- AFTER SCHOOL** ● **SHARED LESSONS (PROPOSED)**
- Subsidized shared private lesson to extend school programme to students affected during Covid restrictions
 - Bursary available

OPERATIONAL RESILIENCE

ABRSM EXAM RESULTS

- 100% pass rate
- 86% with Merit or Distinction

COVID PANDEMIC

- Continued to provide virtual learning to private lesson students
- Government restrictions allowed return to in person P4 Programme in Term 3 2022
- Students will be invited to a one-year programme extension delivered as after school shared lesson in Sept 2022

- Through the generosity of a donor, Menuhin has secured a physical location from Sep 2021 to Dec 2022

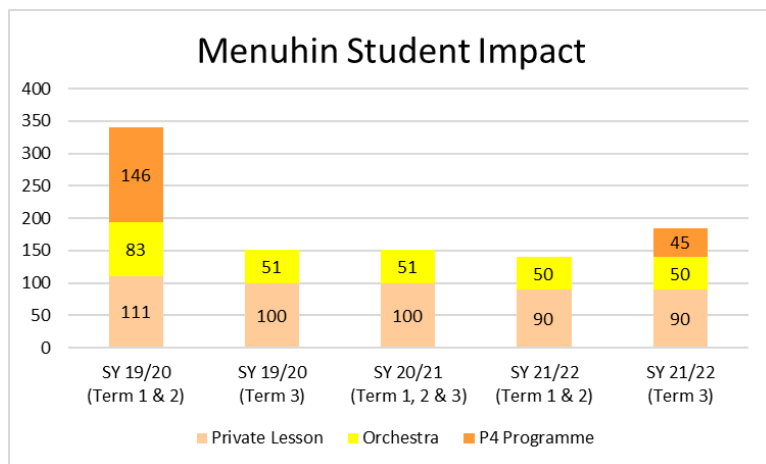
FIRST ORCHESTRA

STUDENT IMPACT

Inability to enter the schools due to the government restrictions has limited the Foundation's impact in the School Year (SY) 2020/2021 for P4 students. In the past, around 150 students participated in this programme. In the last term of SY 2021/2022, 8 schools welcomed Menuhin back to teach the P4 programme with limited group sizes (currently 45 students).

We look forward to grow our presence in the schools to pre-pandemic levels in SY 2022/2023.

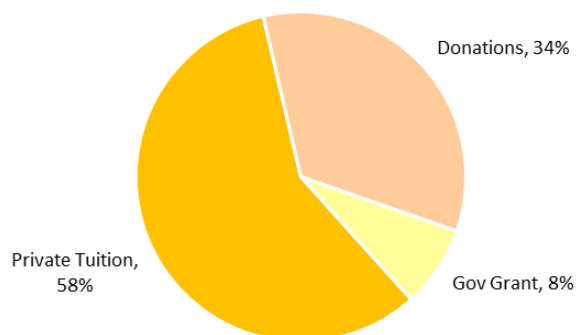
FINANCIAL REPORT

The Foundation relies on approximately \$200,000 of grants and donations annually in order to deliver our services. Our expenses are fixed in nature with over 90% representing compensation for our highly skilled teachers and we strive to keep our operational expenses as low as possible.

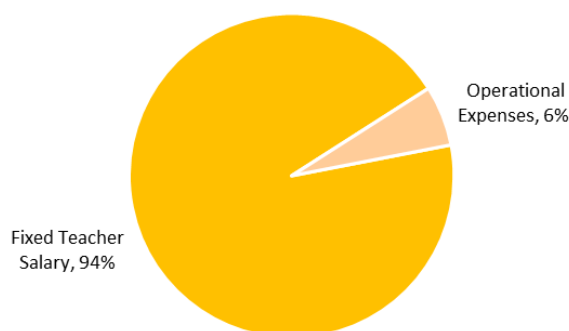
